Directors Note

Earlier this year Frayed Knot produced the massively successful "The 39 Steps" (directed brilliantly by Naomi Glasser) to great acclaim here at The Court Theatre. That production was a version of the same show currently wowing audiences in the West End with the prestigious tag of "Comedy of the Year Award". The 39 Steps was a comic take on the classic Hitchcock film produced in the 1930s. The show had a cast of just four actors, playing nearly 100 parts, reproducing planes, trains and automobiles from minimal set and props. After that, the question was asked "What next? How can you top that?" The Italian Job seems to be the obvious choice. The film has matured with age as millions of people now hold it in fond regard as one of the classic British films of the Twentieth Century. It is a celebration of all things British when London was at the heart of the Swinging Sixties. It is the era of British innovation, design and fashion with the mini car and the mini skirt serving as iconic symbols of a new pop culture. The film follows the adventures of a new type of working class hero; Croker's gang take on the threat of global economic competition embodied by the giant Italian Fiat car company with a plan to steal £4 million dollars of gold from the company and from under the noses of the deadly Italian Mafia. There are car chases galore in the film, with crashes and explosions. Vehicles of all kind speed their way through Turin. They fall off cliffs, down ravines, over roof tops, through subways, sewers, shopping centres and rivers. All this will be performed right before your very eyes on The Court Theatre stage this evening.

Somewhat experimental with only a flim sy idea of how this might work on stage we have embarked upon a journey of discovery trying to make things work during rehearsal. We still don't know whether everything will work. We may indeed come across to you as a bunch of nutters who have lost the plot. But whether we live or die - the journey has been fun. So come with us on our journey now. Fasten your seat belt. It might be a bit bumpy. But we hope you have fun.
