

Welcome to **Jeffrey Bernard is Unwell**. You are here for one of one of three reasons:

- 1) You love good theatre
- 2) You've heard of this through word of mouth or the press
- 3) You know me.

Whatever your reasons I'm glad you're here and seeing as you're here let me tell you a little bit about the show and the man. Jeffery Bernard was infamous in certain circles as a womaniser, a drunk and a bloody good story teller. He spent most of his professional life as a journalist for various different publications including the sporting life and the spectator. He was a hopeless gambler and alcoholic who spent most his life looking for as much trouble as he could. And he found it. He was married four times but was known to have various mistresses and "female acquaintances". He spent most of his life homeless and because he spent his time in an alcoholic blur he didn't really care where he lived or who he lived with just as long as he had somewhere to crash after a long night at the coach and horses. One of the many people who ended up drinking with him was writer Keith Waterhouse. Keith was so fascinated with him that he decided to write this play.

Jeffrey was originally to be played by John Hurt who was a friend of his but eventually it was Peter O toole who got the gig and it was immediately apparent that he was the right choice. O toole played him twice, once in 1990 and again in 1999 after Bernard had passed away. Various actors including James Bolam and Robert Powell have played him and now it's time for Simon Hill to play him.

Directing this show has been a strange experience for me. Usually as a director you find a show and spend a couple of years in development. I found out about this show three months ago and have since then spent all of my time trying to get to grips with the reality of directing a show that is completely utobiographical. Everyone in this show existed. All of the stories and all of the monologues really happened. This is not fiction, it is fact. But it is one of the funniest and at times most touching pieces of theatre ever written and my only hope is that you dear audience get half the enjoyment of watching it as I have had directing it.

Simon Hill

Simon has been an actor and director for over 40 years, initially in North London, where he was a founding member of Chicken Shed and also played lead roles in *The Winslow Boy, Whose Life Is It Anyway, Entertaining Mr Sloane*, and *The Elephant Man*. Since moving to the Tring area 25 years ago, he has appeared regularly at the Pendley Shakespeare Festival, the Aylesbury Limelight, Little Gaddesden, as well as the Court Theatre, and at the Bridewell, the Lion & Unicorn, and Questors in London. Roles have included as Macbeth, Macduff and Duncan(*Macbeth*), Oswald and Edmund (*King Lear*), Polonius (*Hamlet*,twice), Baptista Minola (*Taming of the Shrew*, twice), Duike Vincentio (*Measure for Measure*), Doctor Miranda (*Death & the Maiden*), the Ratcatcher (*Kindertransport*), Ludwig (*Cabaret*), Lord Illingworth (*Woman of No Importance*), Serebryakov (*Uncle Vanya*) and both name parts in *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead*.
