




Cast synopses

Colin Bryer (Hemlock Marreau) is one of the founding members of Frayed Knot and has played the eponymous hero in all but one of the Marreau plays. He has also appeared in numerous other productions by Frayed Knot and by other societies, most notably his many plays with Pendley Theatre Company.

Jenny Booth (*Gwendolyn Smith*) has also been in every Marreau except the last one, usually, but not exclusively playing the part of Gwendolyn. Another founder member of F.K. she has appeared in nearly all our productions playing many varied rôles, though specialising in dotty old dears!

Graham Double (*Simon Simpson*) rarely appears with Frayed Knot these days, performing more regularly with his local society in Stewkley, however he normally comes out of the woodwork to appear in Marreaus, though like Colin & Jenny he missed the last outing. We're glad to have him back though because no-one plays a twerp with quite such ease and accuracy as Graham!

Rob Farrow (*Insp. Farmer*) is inextricably linked with the Marreau plays - as he writes and directs them as well as playing the ubiquitous Inspector. Yet another founder member and currently Chairman of F.K., Rob has appeared in and directed many productions by the society and occasionally acts with other societies in the area.

This is the first Frayed Knot production for **John Copas** (*Prof. Liggat*) who thankfully stepped into the breach half way through rehearsals when one of our cast was taken ill. John is regularly seen singing and acting with Vale G&S, and used to be a leading light in F.K.'s predecessor Phoenix.

Marreau was ably played by **Ian Wells** (*Dr. Finn*) in the last show (*Tregalleon Inheritance*), and also when we re-ran the very first Marreau in 1997. However Ian more usually plays one of Marreau's adversaries - including his bête noir, Professor Maurice Hearty! Ian has performed with many societies notably Vale G&S and Chuckles and many shows with F.K.

This is **Helen Bryer**'s (*Dr. Mary Danvers*) first play with Frayed Knot, but she has appeared in several pantomimes and was also in TFC's production of Bugsy Malone. Hopefully she will become an F.K. regular like her father.

Another newcomer to Frayed Knot is **Dave Barratt** (*Henry Spector*) who is very busy at present - as after completing this show, he is in TFC's production of *Stepping Out* next week and in Vale's *Merry Widow* the following week. I hope he doesn't get the parts mixed-up!

Making his stage debut is the author's son, **Edward Farrow** (*Edward Liggat*). Having had a few lines in his school's Christmas play, Edward decided that he wanted a bigger part - so his dad managed to find him one! Edward now wants to be in all future Marreaus and has even suggested some new titles!

Dave Reece (*Dr. Wolf*) is a stalwart of the Tring entertainment scene, having acted in numerous productions, drummed at countless gigs and help organise many events particularly for TFC. Dave has appeared in several Marreaus including the last one where he played two very different rôles.

Stepping valiantly into the rôle of Simpson last year, **Jeremy O'Gorman** (*Dr. Slough*) should find this character somewhat different! Since joining F.K., Jeremy has been a regular performer and also help with producing several of our shows. He also acts with several other societies in the area including TFC and Prospect.

No stranger to the boards, Lindsay Smith (Dr. Doris Crabbe) has been in dozens of shows with most of the local societies, including acting in and directing Lady Windermere's Fan for F.K. and a cameo role in our recent production of Saving Ardley. Lindsay also writes and co-ordinates productions including her own one-woman show which is a real tour-de-force.

Naomi Glasser (*Dr. Elizabeth Winger*) first joined us to play the adventurous Laura Taft in *Requiem for Marreau*. After playing the soppy Diana Pringle in the last Marreau she then took on an enormous rôle in our production of Saving Ardley which we performed last year in aid of the WWF.

John Ross - the definitive *Dr. Protheroe*! Having only ever played the rôle which has made him famous, in 2002 John branched out and was seen (but not heard) in our production of *Lady Windermere's Fan*!

The third of our second-generation stars - **Maxine Reece** (*Ellen Madison*) has acted in several F.K. productions and in numerous productions with other local companies. As Lily in *Requiem for Marreau* she famously announced that one of the suspects had been caught by the Gruttocks!
